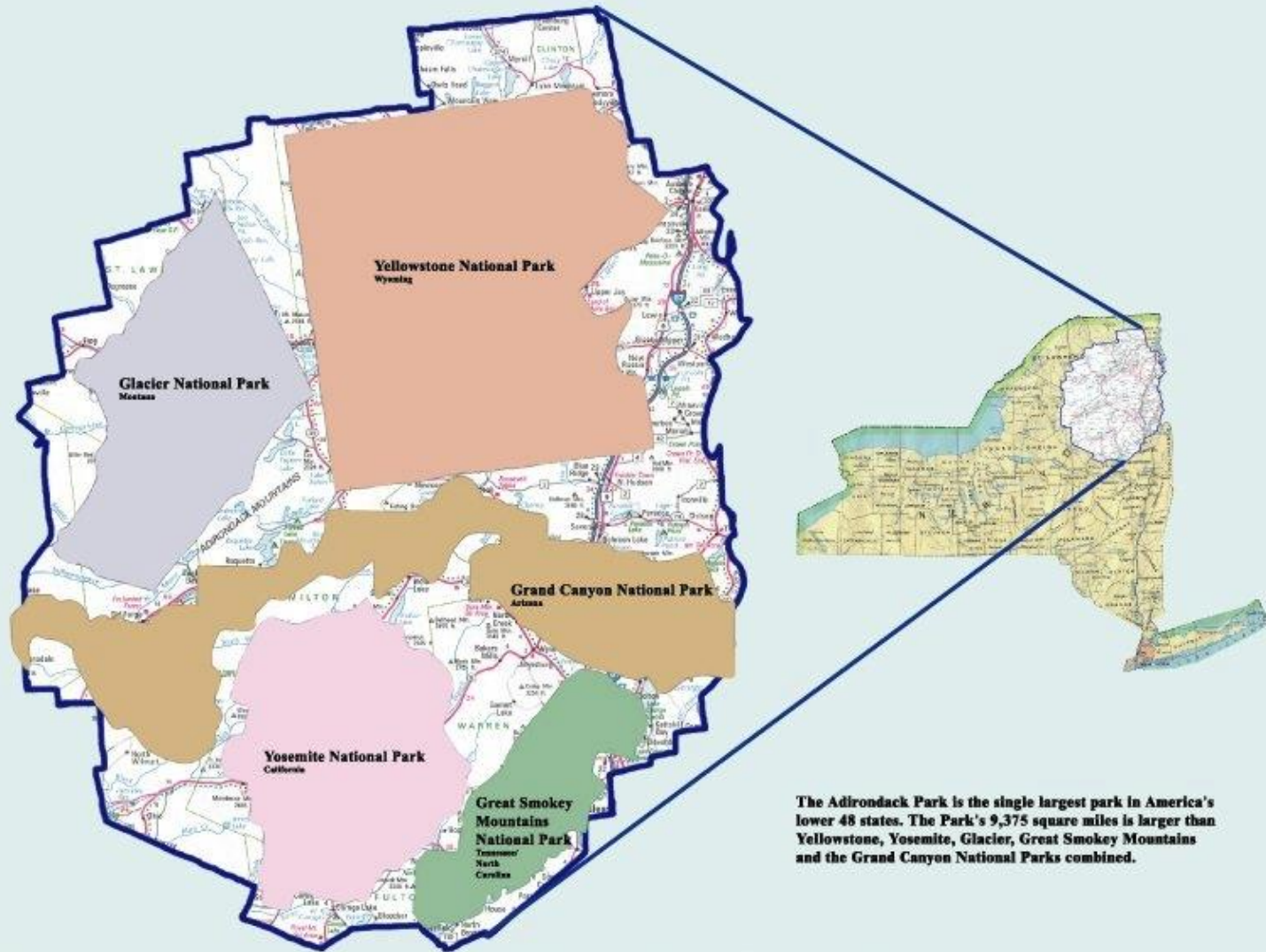

The Adirondack Park is the single largest park in America's lower 48 states. The Park's 9,375 square miles is larger than Yellowstone, Yosemite, Glacier, Great Smokey Mountains and the Grand Canyon National Parks combined.
